

Comparison of New Brunswick's minimum wage with the Atlantic average

January 2010

- **NB: \$8.25**
- NF & L: \$9.50
- NS: \$8.60
- PEI: \$8.40

Atl. Average: $\$34.75 / 4 = \8.69 .

Therefore NB Workers make **44¢ per hour less** (\$8.69 - \$8.25)

April 2010

- **NB: \$8.50**
- NF & L: \$9.50
- NS: \$9.20
- PEI: \$8.40

Atl. Average: $\$35.60 / 4 = \8.90 .

Therefore NB workers will make **40¢ per hour less** (\$8.90 - \$8.50)

September 2010

- **NB: \$9.00**
- NF & L: \$10.00
- NS: \$9.20
- PEI: \$8.40

Atl. Average: $\$36.60 / 4 = \9.15 .

Therefore, NB workers will make **15¢ per hour less** (\$9.15 - \$9.00)

January 2011

- **NB: \$9.00**
- NF & L: \$ 10.00
- NS: \$9.65
- PEI: \$8.40

Atl. average: Sum of $\$37.05 / 4 = \9.26 .

Therefore, NB workers will make **26¢ per hour less** (\$9.26 - \$9.00)

April 2010

- **NB: \$9.50**
- NF & L: \$10.00
- NS: \$9.65
- PEI: \$8.40

Atl. Average: Sum of $\$37.55 / 4 = \9.39

Therefore, NB workers will make **11¢ per hour more** (\$9.50 - \$9.39)

In April 2010, NB workers will make more **IF** all the other provinces stay the same
