

Open letter to Premier Shawn Graham

Premier Graham,

We were all enthused when we heard, back in October 2008, that your government was about to develop an initiative aimed at reducing poverty in this province.

Based on what was unveiled, we figured that the public would participate fully in this enterprise and would take an active part towards its realization up to the end of the process. We saw in this initiative a good example of participatory democracy.

This is the reason why there were over 2,500 citizens and a high number of organizations like ours involved in the public hearings as well as the written comments during the Phase I of the process, called The Public Dialogue. The document "A Choir of Voices -What Was Said Report" which followed the Dialogue seemed to be a true reflection of what had been discussed during these meetings.

Phase II, that of the Roundtable sessions, has just finished its work.

There were some thirty participants who debated during twelve days the various options and who came up with a document with specific options.

This document will serve as the basis for discussions in the Final Forum, from which yourself, as Chairperson, along with a new group of participants, will draw the final proposal to be submitted to Cabinet.

We are worried, however, **that this document is not available to the general public.** We see this as **an unfortunate breach to the democratic process** that you had undertaken.

There is no question, in our mind, that this important document should be made public to enable citizens to express their own options in terms of what should be done to reduce poverty. They could also propose the solutions they see best for society as a whole.

**This is why we urge you to make this document public as soon as possible.**
