

Exhibits depicts social injustice

A new art exhibit going up this week inside Moncton City Hall helps paint a stark picture of the inequities that exist around us.

Two Different Worlds is the main theme for the second annual art exhibit organized by the Common Front for Social Justice which opened Monday.

The aim of the exhibit with its chosen themes of health, housing, food, clothing, transportation and distribution of wealth consists of paintings and collages that cry out for social justice and closing the gap between the rich and the poor and for a better quality of life for everyone.

One art work submitted by Daniel Légère of Memramcook shows a table for the affluent brimming with rich foods alongside a table for the poor containing a food box. Work by Auréa Cormier of Moncton shows the huge contrast between luxury homes and mobile trailers, while James LeBlanc of Moncton and Peter Borden of Moncton offered art work showing the contrast in means of transportation
